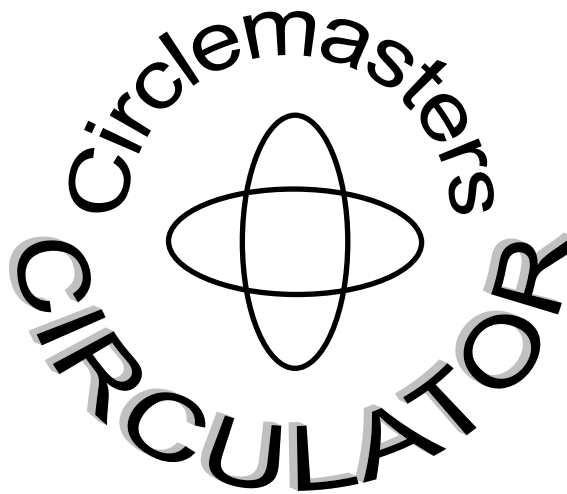
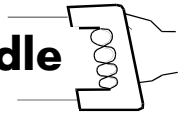

Library Open House

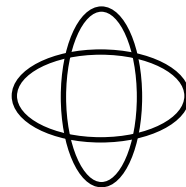
The Circlemasters C/L Club model airplane display and Open House at the Village of Sussex Pauline Haas Library was held on Saturday 4/18 from 1:00 to 3:00 pm. Members Dave Siegler, Jason Nettesheim, John Schram, Pres. Greg Schmidt, and Don Adriano were in attendance to answer questions and to promote the Club and Control Line, in general. In addition to the member's planes already on display in the showcase and hanging from the ceiling, a video loop entitled "Wired for Excitement" was shown on the library's TV and DVD player. Dave set up his small engine display with some engines assembled and disassembled and the tools needed to work on them. His purpose was to answer inquiries about model airplane engines and how they operate. A table was set up to allow kids to make the foam penny gliders traced on egg carton tops and cut out with scissors.

The first hour saw only a few people curious enough to enter the display room, mainly due to the sign pointing to the large meeting room. Those that came in commented favorably on the hanging planes. In that first hour, 2 or 3 adults expressed keen interest in the Club and it's activities. Two youngsters built the gliders with assistance from Greg, John, Jason, and Don. With some fine trimming and adjustment of the penny, the planes flew pretty well and the kids had fun learning how to launch them.

The second hour was well attended by both adults and kids. Several adults inquired about the Club and it's activities.....expressing interest in parent/child involvement.

There were 6-7 young people that made the gliders and it kept the members busy adjusting the planes so they would fly well. The room was a bit small for all the parents, kids, and the penny planes in the air. Nevertheless, everyone seemed to enjoy themselves.

Even with the effort expended by all members to put on the display and the Open House, the Club may or may not gain members. But the goodwill created within the community can only enhance our already excellent rapport with the Village of Sussex.

A PRACTICE CIRCLE FOR PAMPA STUNT WILL OPEN AT 8 AM.

OFFICIAL FLIGHTS WILL BEGIN AT 9 AM.

MUFFLERS FOR STUNT AND SCALE (OTHER THAN HALF A) ARE REQUIRED. THE MUFFLERS MUST BE STOCK, TONGUE OR AFTER MARKET MUFFLERS.
