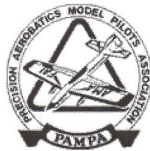

July meeting: Saturday July 6th at Sussex Village Park. Meeting at 1:00 PM flying before and after the meeting.

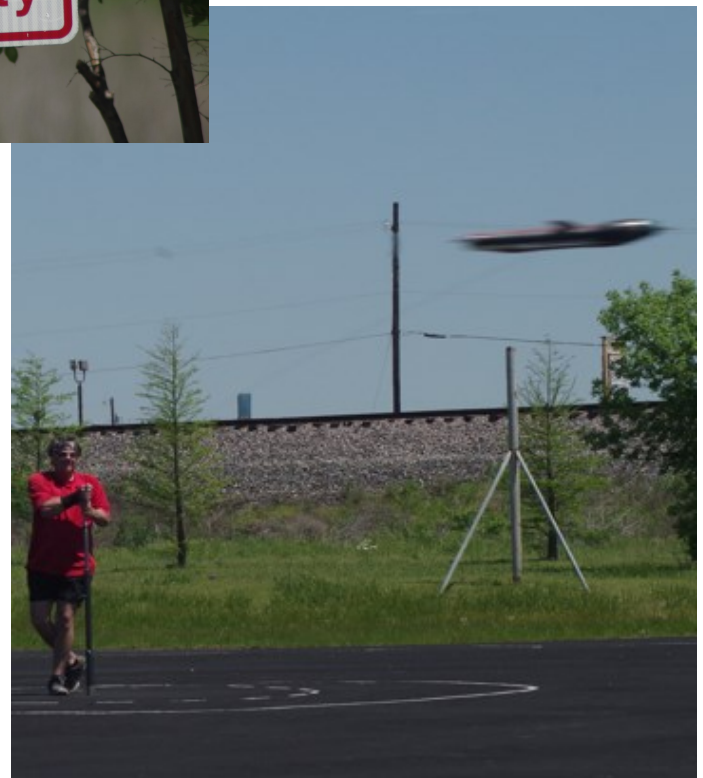
